


We are so fortunate to have Mrs. Murphy assisting us in Lower Primary this year.





FOLDERS



- Your child brings home a <u>blue</u> folder and student planner every day.
- On a daily basis, your child will be entering his/her homework and/or little reminders as well as weekly spelling words in their student planner. Please remember to check this daily.
- Please check the <u>blue folder</u> nightly for homework, corrected papers, and notices and make sure they are returned the next day.
- Any notes or money sent back to school should be returned in envelopes inside the <u>blue folder</u>.
- It is your child's responsibility to see to it that they give them to me in the morning.
- It is never too early to instill organizational skills and a sense of responsibility.

- All homework is to be done in PENCIL ONLY unless otherwise stated.

reading log

This year I will be using a digital reading log rather than the reading log folder I have used in the past. Each night after your child completes their 15 minutes (or more if they'd like) of reading, please complete the following:

- 1. Go to Google Classroom
- 2. Have your child sign in to their account using their school email and password you were sent at the beginning of the year.
- 3. Click on "Mrs. Mastro's Lower Primary" Class
- 4.On the Stream page at the top you will see "Reading Log for Week of Sept. 21"
- 5. Click on the blue link
- 6. You will now be in a Google Form
- 7. Answer the questions (Name, Date, Title of Book, Read TO, WITH or BY child and parent initials)
- 8.Click "Submit"

It's that easy! Use this same link all year. I will make sure it is at the top of the Stream on Google Classroom everyday. All digital reading logs should be submitted through Google Forms on the Google Classroom by 8 a.m. using the above directions.

I look forward to seeing all the great books your child is reading at home as well as the topics they are interested in.




grading

SNACKS

- Please remind your child there is NO sharing of food during snack or lunchtime.


LUNCH

- You may also order online at: <u>www.scholastic.com/bookclubs</u> and enter class activation code H7FR4.


BIRTHDAYS

Learn this year



RELIGION

- Students will develop a deeper understanding of their faith, as well as a sense of community.
- Lower Primary began the year learning about the story of Creation.
- Students will journey through the life of Jesus from His birth to His Resurrection.
- Students will understand the Sacrament of Baptism and Holy Objects used during Mass and in Church.
- 2nd grade students will begin preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion mid January.

READING

- Literacy instruction will take place through whole group and small group lessons.
- Students will be exposed to a variety of literature through read alouds, author studies and thematic units.
- Students will develop independence and stamina with reading and writing over time using the structure of the Daily 5.
- Each student will have their own book box to keep their "good fit" books in.

SPELLING LISTS

- Weekly spelling lists will be part of the Lower Primary curriculum.
- Students take pretest on Monday to determine the list (A, B, C) they will be working on during the week.
- Spelling tests occur on Friday mornings.
- Weekly spelling words are always written in their student planner on the page opposite their weekly assignments.





- Math curriculum will be differentiated based on students' needs using the enVision math series and math centers.
- Manipulatives are used whenever possible to introduce new concepts and to help bridge the gap from the concrete to the abstract.
- Manipulatives include ten frames, place value blocks, linking cubes, chips, coins, rulers, graphs, clocks and calendars.



Science



 Science units will provide for hands-on opportunities along with STREAM challenges

Students will utilize a Science Interactive Notebook to record information and completed projects.
